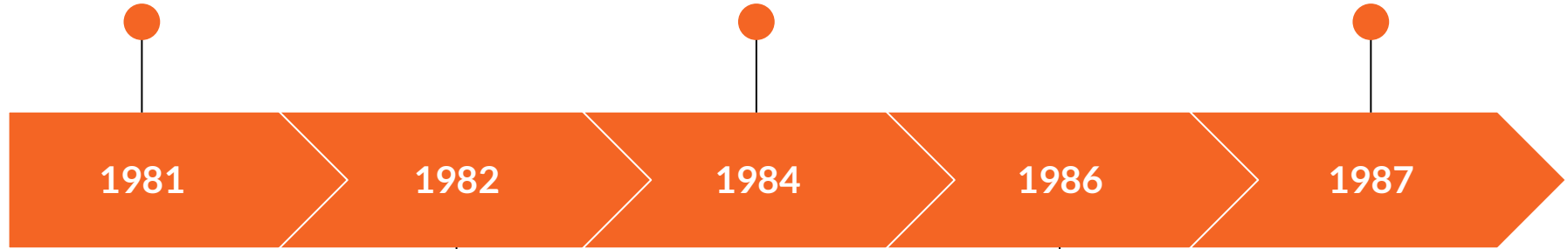

Out of 270 cases of pneumonia in young men in LA, 121 die

Virus discovered as cause of AIDS; first test is developed

1st ART drug approved by FDA; Reagan makes 1st speech about AIDS



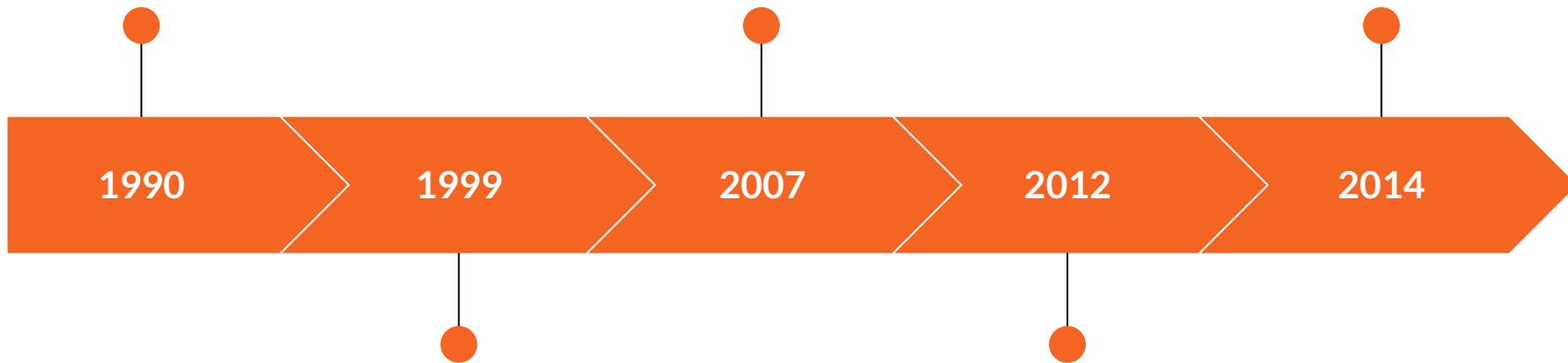
CDC uses the term AIDS for first time

Virus named HIV; the AIDS memorial quilt project begins

Congress passes Ryan
White CARE Act

565,000 have died of
AIDS in US since 1981

U=U People with an
Undetectable viral load
are untransmittable

WW, #1 in Africa; 33M
HIV+, 14M deaths

The Denver Principles

Articulated in Denver in 1983

By the PWA (People With AIDS)
self-empowerment movement

Statement

We condemn attempts to label us as "victims," a term which implies defeat, and we are only occasionally "**patients**," a term which implies passivity, helplessness, and dependence upon the care of others. We are "**People With AIDS.**"
